


Let's talk about DSC

- Survey says....wait what's DSC again?
 - DOMAIN STATISTICS COLLECTOR
 - Different from DITL
 - OARC's first born
 - Stats on traffic analysis is gathered at Root Servers, more frequently, aggregated and sent over to OARC. If you're a member running DSC software you'll get to see things happening in real time.
- Very small sample size but there are a couple things that we can conclude.
 - The large majority of you think DSC is a useful service, and work to improve the service it provides
 - More specifically the development of the tool itself needs to be prioritized , because some of you think it's obsolete
 - OARC is the place for DSC
- And since visualization is considered at least somewhat critical to all of you.....




How much do you care about sharing DNS instrumentation data within the community?

Other Take Aways From the DSC Survey

- Upload rate down 70% because....
 - Reaction to more stringent privacy regulations
 - "Poor choice of data format, bothersome data collectors, passable UI...I'd like you to build on existing metrics infrastructure and design a DNS specific frontend"
 - Data isn't being exploited by researchers, so it's easy to forget the value
- Some good suggestions for how we can motivate you to upload data
- Some good suggestions of what you'd like to see researchers do with the data
- Next steps
 - Chatting up individuals
 - Resourcing
